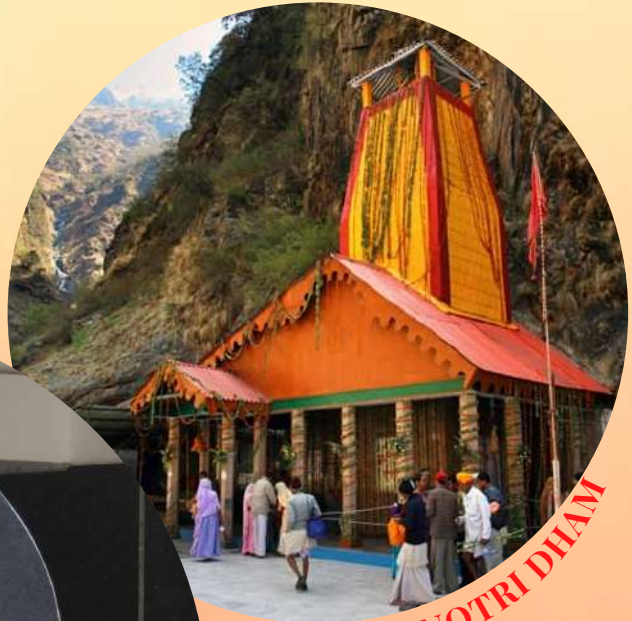

## FROM EDITOR'S DESK

For all its eventfulness, 2020 has been for the humanity, a year they would like to erase from their memories. The onslaught of the corona virus pandemic impacted mankind in every walk of life.

SVHM Society continued their charitable work with full vigour and dedication as the pandemic failed to deter the team of dedicated and sincere professionals.

The first few months which were an era of LOCK-DOWN, the Society hospitals kept operational their emergency services including investigations as well as limited OPD consultations. The surgeries, community health programs and the multispeciality camps had to be temporarily suspended.

The Society hospitals however did not wait long enough and made functional their full spectrum of services following the COVID guidelines as laid down by the government time to time.

Apart from health the social and educational initiatives were also kept afloat during these difficult times through "Badrimala" project for the villagers residing around Badrinath Dham affected due to minuscule number of pilgrims and "e-Shiksha Abhiyaan" where Society supported academic activities like facilitating online classes and free tablets distribution to the students from lower socio-economic section of the Society. The hospital of Kedarnath Dham could not be opened as the yatra remained suspended, however Badrinath Dham hospital was made operational on request of local folk and the temple committee.

All the other hospitals were dealing with the fever patients separately and other patients were treated as per their ailments accordingly. Full-fledged surgeries resumed but were done only after the patients tested negative for COVID.

Some of our hospital staff also became infected with COVID in this tenure however all of them recovered fully to re-join and serve again. The decline in COVID cases in later part of year saw community health programs and community medical camps recommencement.

SVCH Dharmawala achieved one more milestone by starting "Panchkarma centre" in their Ayurveda department.

The last quarter had a major achievement for the Society as their ninth hospital became operational at Haridwar on 24th January 2021. This hospital which is providing totally free services to the Saint community came as a boon also to the sick and needy pilgrims who visited the holy city for the auspicious "Mahakumbh" festival.

Also, preparations are in full swing for the tenth hospital of the Society to be opened at Gangotri Dham once the Chardham yatra starts.

All this endeavour of the Society is not possible without the selfless support from our numerous donor organizations and individuals. A deep gratitude to all of them and the Society will always remain highly obliged for their trust and belief bestowed upon us.

Signing off with the hope that the new year ushers hope, happiness and a healthy India and world.

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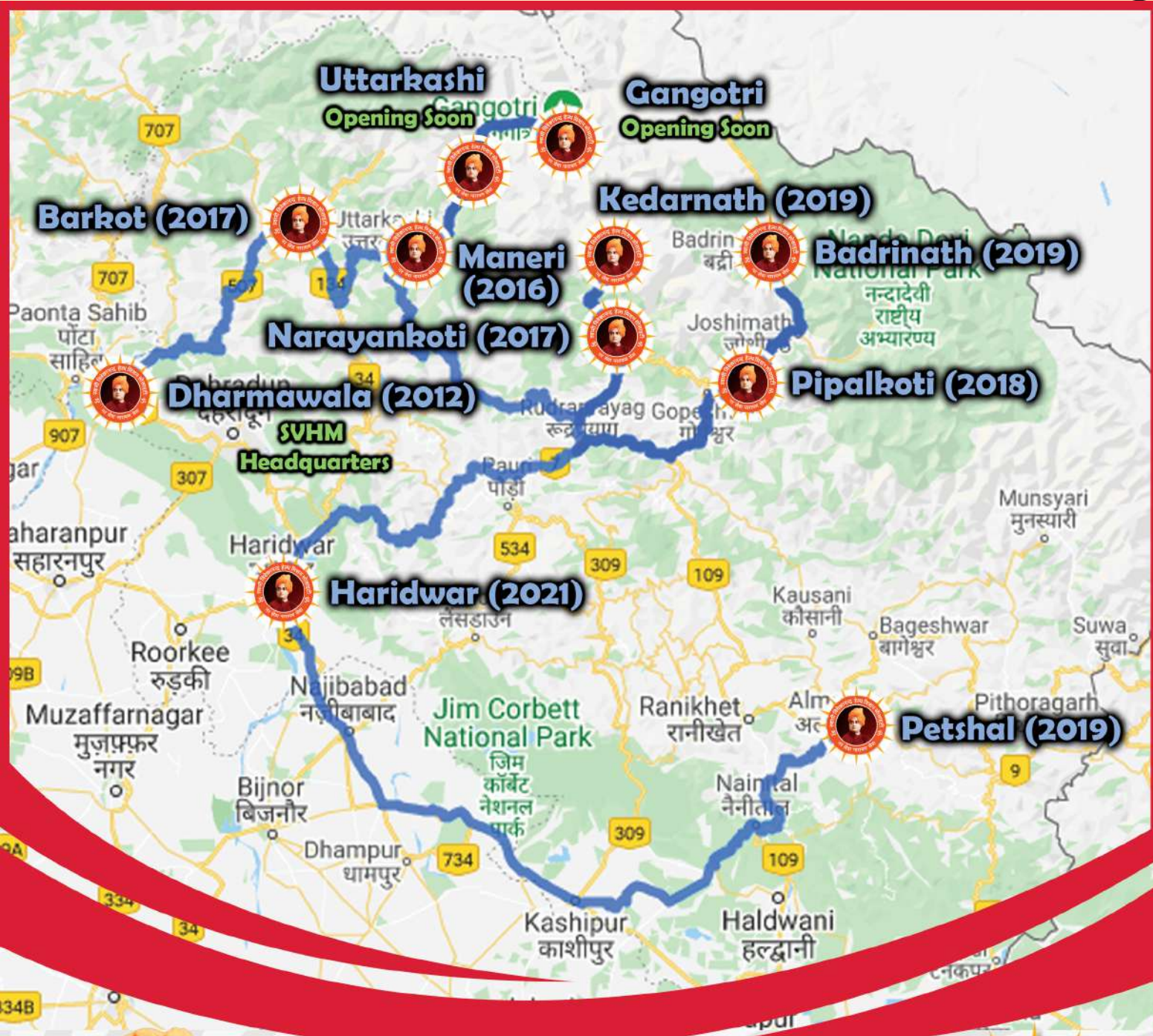

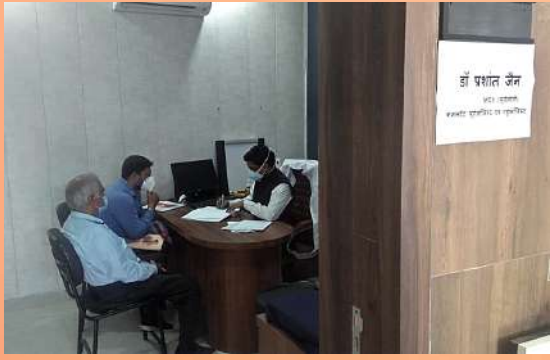

# COMMUNITY HEALTH PROJECTS

## DHARMAWALA

### Community Women's Health and Mental Health Programs

New project for Anemia Prevention and Control Program. Resumption of ongoing projects of breast and cervical cancer screening, menstrual hygiene and mental health which were temporarily suspended last year because of Corona virus pandemic.

#### ANEMIA PROGRAM

Anemia still remains a public health problem in India with more than 50% of its women, adolescent girls and children less than five suffering from this disorder. Started as a pilot project from a tribal dominated village, SVHM aims to reduce the prevalence of Anemia by 50% in the targeted population over a designated time period. Apart from providing services like Hb level estimation and medicine distribution the program is also focusing on inculcating healthy dietary habits, hygiene and dietary diversification with inclusion of locally available iron rich food in their diet.

- Number of beneficiaries contacted: **428**
- Number having Anemia: **237 (56 %)**

#### BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER AWARENESS AND SCREENING PROGRAM

Breast cancer is the most common and Cervical cancer is the second most common cancer in women in India. Both of these are preventable and our program emphasizes on the same. We focus on detection by regular screening including tests like Mammography, Pap smear, blood tests etc. and regular follow up. Also we focus on awareness and teaching self-examination.

- Number of females (30 yrs and above till menopause) contacted for the program: **64**
- Number of females screened at Dharmawala hospital: **36**

#### MY PAD (MENSTRUAL HYGIENE) PROGRAM

National Family Health Survey 2015-2016 estimates that of the 33.6 crore menstruating women in India about 12 crore (approx 36 %) women are using sanitary napkins, locally or commercially produced. A 2016 study titled – 'Menstrual hygiene management among adolescent girls in India' involving nearly 1 lakh girls in India found that almost 50 thousand did not know about menstruation until the first time they got their period. My pad being an awareness program entails to make aware and dispel the myths associated with the menstruation as well as teach how to maintain menstrual hygiene. Apart from this we also distributed free menstrual pads to the beneficiaries.

- Number of adolescent girls and menstruating females attended individual counselling session regarding menstrual hygiene program: **136**

Note: Due to COVID, the previously conducted group counselling sessions has been switched to personal and one-to-one counselling.

#### MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM

- Number of persons surveyed: **684**
- Number of suspected cases detected: **161**
- Number of confirmed cases treated at Dharmawala hospital: **88**

Weekly follow up is being done regularly for compliance and severe anemic cases are being referred and treated at Dharmawala hospital. We are also focusing on IEC by providing information booklets to the beneficiaries and educating them about hygiene and healthy food habits. Also we are counselling the beneficiaries to include locally available iron rich foods and adopt lifestyle modifications in their daily habits and routine.

Mental health patients are identified through a well defined questionnaire and follow up of the treated patients has been done in every 15 days.

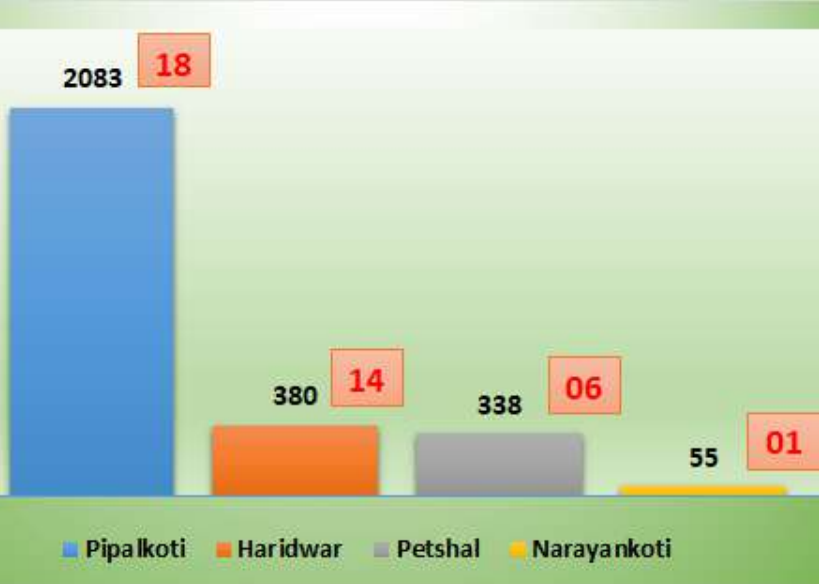

### SERVICES PROVIDED

The services offered in these camps included general examination, temperature, weight and blood pressure measurement, investigations like blood sugar estimation, Hemoglobin and ECG and dental consultation. Also, the patients were dispensed medicines as prescribed during the consultations. The patients requiring further assessment and specialist consultation were referred to our base hospitals.

All the above-mentioned services were provided totally free of cost.

*The aim of these community medical camps is to provide health services to people who otherwise, in many areas, have nil to limited access to quality health care and facilities. Due to lack of proper transport, difficult terrains and their poor financial status, the sick and needy population is often unable to visit to the health facilities which are usually far off and often incur high expenditure. These medical camps are purposely held in distant and hilly places to bridge the gap in achieving universal health coverage.*

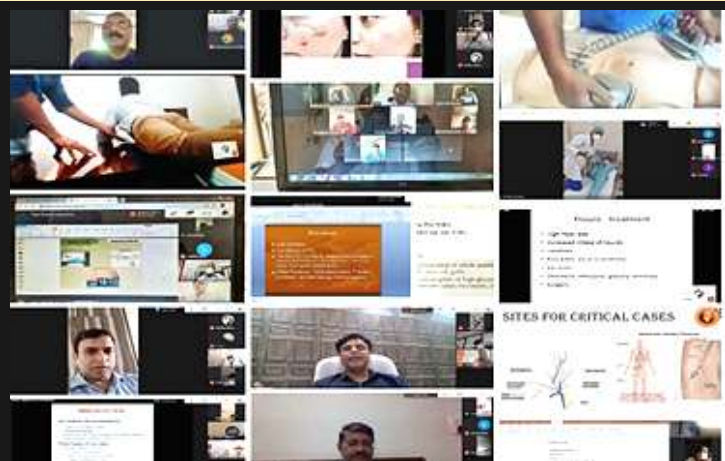

**PIPALKOTI: ROAD TRAFFIC ACCIDENT CASE MANAGED AND A LIFE SAVED**



In a tragic car accident near Joshimath, 3 passengers were critically injured and out of which the third patient, a 10 yr. old boy could not be shifted to higher centre due to bad weather conditions and was brought in a critical condition having suffered from multiple fractures. Pipalkoti team under the expert guidance of Dr Pawan Garg, an Orthopaedician private practitioner at Agra, who was available at that time gave his help and valuable guidance to stabilize the patient successfully before referring him to higher center.

**BADRINATH: SELFIE GONE WRONG**



Ravindra a tourist hailing from the state of Haryana was on a visit to Badrinath Dham and nearby places when he met with an unfortunate incident. While attempting to take selfie from the edge of the bridge over river Saraswati named Bheempul, he slipped and fell down on the dry part of the riverbed, resulting in multiple injuries on his head.

The Badrinath hospital team immediately attended to his injuries including suturing of his wounds and other necessary treatment thus saving his life.

**BADRINATH: TRAUMA MANAGEMENT**



A truck carrying 25 BRO employees met with an accident near Ghastoli Village of District Chamoli, leading to trauma to all the occupants. Out of 25 injured employees, 3 critically injured were immediately given the emergency treatment on a priority and were referred to the higher center for further management and needful.

The remaining employees were then managed accordingly and were provided treatment free of cost.

**DHARMAWALA: LEECH REMOVED**



A 61 yrs old male patient arrived at our hospital with complaints of pain in throat and nose as well as repeated nasal blockage since past more than 1 month. As per the history he supposedly swallowed a leech while drinking water from a pond and was in agony since then. Finally this blood sucking parasite was successfully removed by Dr. Shreya, our ENT Specialist with utmost precision and care.

**DHARMAWALA: DISTAL MYOPATHY PANCHKARMA TREATMENT**



A 21 yrs. old male patient, case of distal myopathy was referred to Ayurveda for Panchkarma therapy with the chief complaint of weakness and wasting of right hand since approximately last 7-8 months. As shown in the images after 15 days of treatment muscle mass of thenar and hypothenar areas improved as well as there was improvement in release of flexion contractures of all the involved fingers. The patient regained strength in right hand at three week-follow up (as per his statement).

*What makes these events noteworthy is that there are no quality healthcare facilities in the Chardham's and other difficult to reach and hilly areas for dealing with such mishaps and emergencies and the SVHM Society hospitals fill that critical gap. Some of the patients while recounting their tragic experience were highly grateful to the SVHM hospital staff for providing timely treatment and saving their lives and the SVHM Society for running hospital in these pilgrimages and remote locations.*

*Such medical emergencies throw an obvious light on the real need of the quality healthcare facilities which is being provided at such remote and hard to reach areas by the SVHM Society.*

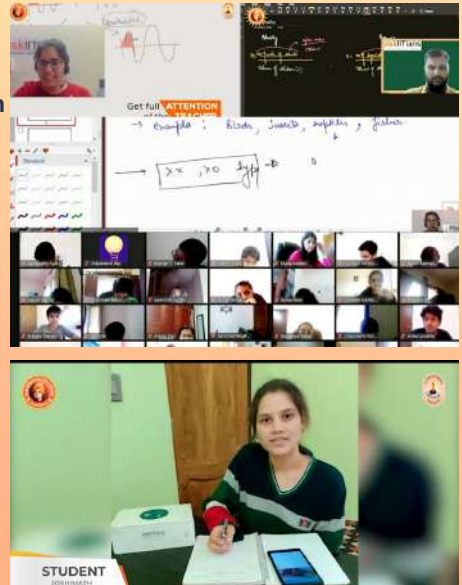
## SHIKSHA ABHIYAN

### E-SHIKSHA ABHIYAN FOR COVID-19 AFFECTED STUDENTS

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, students residing in remote and hilly areas were facing hardships in accomplishing their Academic routine as well as preparatory studies. To address this issue and aiming to provide quality education at their doorsteps, SVHM Society under their Shiksha Abhiyan project helped the students of Saraswati Vidya Mandir Inter Colleges of Joshimath and Gopeshwar, District Chamoli.



SVHM Society in collaboration with askITians has been conducting online classes for the students of these colleges since Sep 2020. Society also distributed free tablets to 22 students from low socioeconomic background hailing from Niti and Urgam Valleys to help them cope up with their online classes.



### HELPING HAND TO SCHOOL

SVHM believes in holistic health of the Society and it is this belief that allows it to venture into other domains. SVCH Badrinath after learning that Saraswati Shishu Mandir of Bamini Village, Badrinath functioning under Vidyabharti needed support informed the Society for needful. Vidyabharti which is a non profit education organisation, runs more than 20000 (around 650 in Uttarakhand) schools across country with the motto to provide value based affordable education to all.

Bamini village's Saraswati Shishu Mandir was functioning in an incompletely built old building till 2019 which badly needed repairs. Also the teaching staff were working on meagre salaries. SVHM Society took to the task of improvement and renovated the school building. Also the Society upgraded the school and teacher's remunerations as well.

What started with one school has now become a full fledged activity and led to the creation of SVHM Shiksha Abhiyan. This unfurled a new chapter in SVHM Society journey as they started helping Vidyabharti in maintaining their schools across Uttarakhand state in remote and inaccessible border areas.

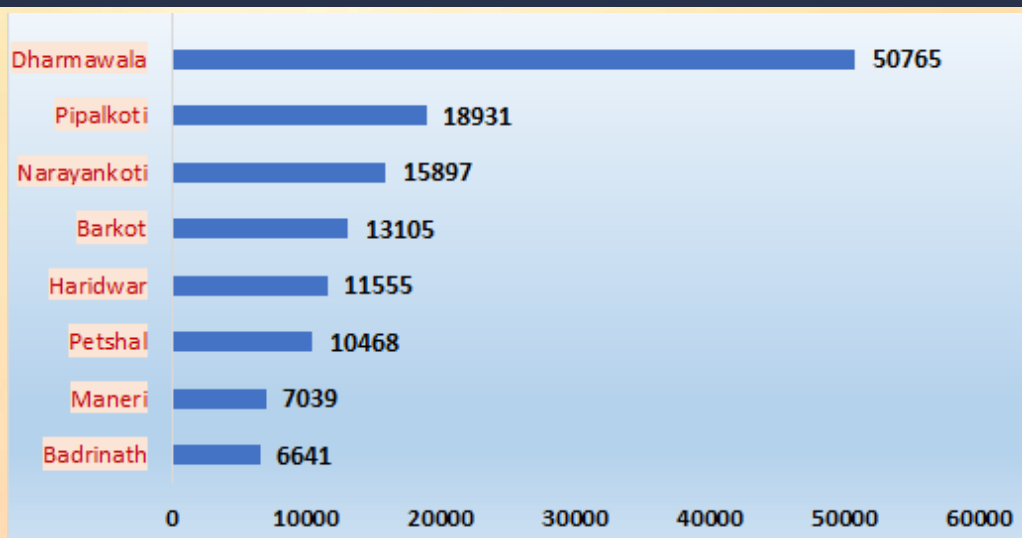

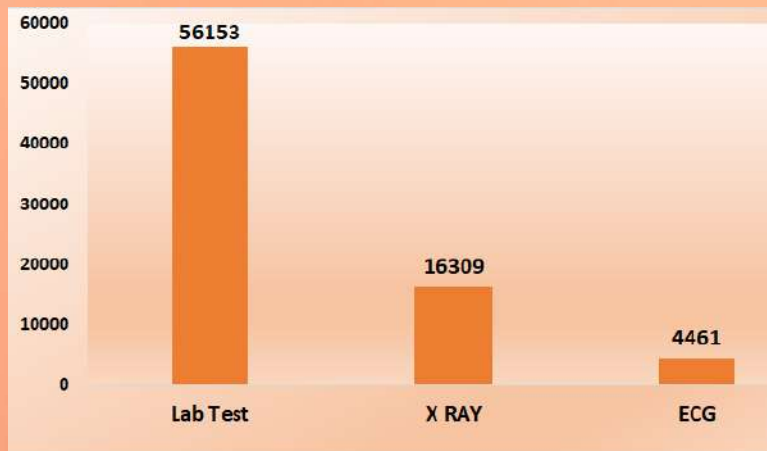

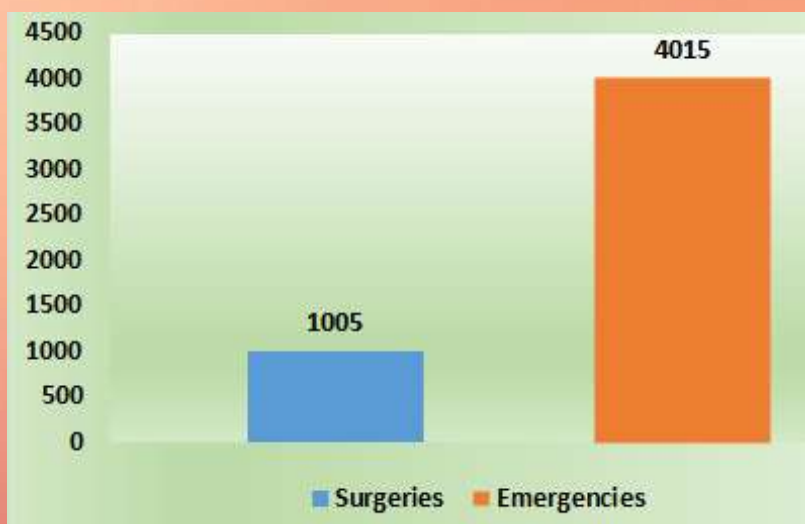


**INVESTIGATIONS**

Surgeries are being conducted at Dharmawala, Barkot, Petshal, Narayankoti, Pipalkoti and Haridwar.

Patients due for surgery and unable to afford the same at private hospitals because of incurring high cost, were successfully operated at our hospitals at a minimal to no cost. Notably during the pandemic, the patients prior to the surgery were tested for COVID - 19 and underwent the procedure only after they tested negative.

Round the clock efforts of our hospitals in dealing with emergencies have succeeded in reducing the fatalities to a marked extent in the remote, hilly and difficult to reach areas.

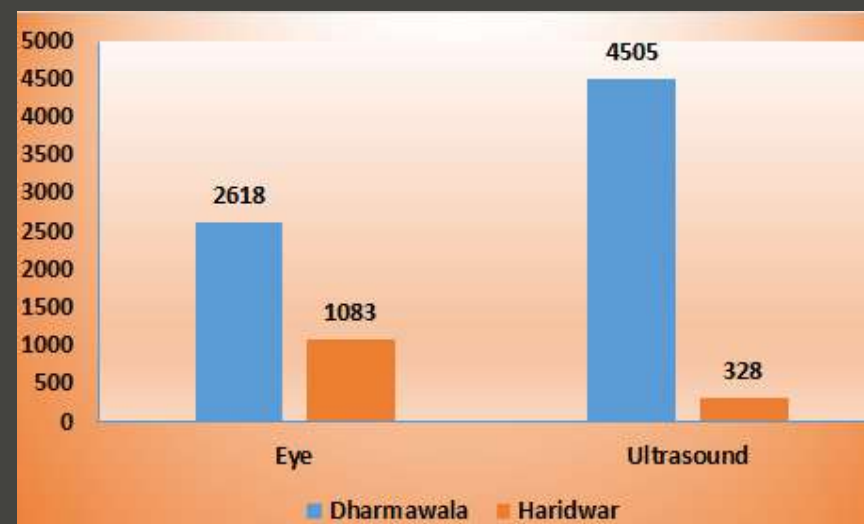
