The event filled year in which Society completed a decade of its selfless service was laden with commencement of new facilities, initiatives and interventions, accolades, recognitions, visits, celebrations, triumphs and achievements. The tally of hospitals being run by the Society rose to twelve with two new hospitals becoming operational at Gangotri Dham and Karol Bagh Delhi respectively.

Collaboration with Spine Foundation Mumbai for Spine OPD and surgeries was welcomed by all quarters as this gave access to a facility which was out of bounds to a major segment of the community due to its high cost and inaccessibility. Other new amenities included arthroscopic / sports injury surgery OPD at Dharmawala hospital, Ayurved and Panchkarm facility and Optical Workshop Lab at Haridwar hospital.

Petshal hospital began Ultrasound facility thus becoming the fourth hospital of the Society to do so. Dharmawala hospital upgraded its Ultrasound to a 3D/4D enabled advanced machine. Two developments which reflected the significance and weightage of the Society in decision making bodies of the Government was inclusion by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare of our Secretary Dr Anuj in the National Assisted Reproductive Technology & Surrogacy Board as one of the nine National level experts. Second was inclusion in the Uttarakhand Char Dham Committee under the PMO for devising measures so as to keep the Char Dham pilgrimage of the devotees smooth and uneventful.

The Society hospitals at three of the Char Dhams continued serving the pilgrims relentlessly and tirelessly and experienced the highest footfall since their inception. Shri Kedarnath hospital had the unique distinction of having catered to approx. 10% of all the pilgrims who visited the holy shrine. In a marked development, Society was able to purchase land near Shri Kedarnath Dham hospital for expansion and the construction process has already begun and similarly Shri Badrinath Dham hospital is also under expansion process. The construction of Keshav Madhav Hospital, Vrindavan is going on in full swing and the Society hopes to dedicate the facility for service to mankind later this year.

The Society hospitals had several visitors who with their encouraging words, appreciation and gestures gave cherishable moments to the team of dedicated SVHM Society professionals. The year ended on a splendid note when Society shifted their Maneri hospital to a larger premise at Maharishi Bhrigu Ashram Uttarkashi and which was formally inaugurated on 4th April 2023.

A new team took over the reins of the Society with the promise to continue the selfless and altruistic journey to new peaks. The upcoming year is poised to witness a big expansion of the facilities and hospitals as well as broadening of the horizon. Society entered into a MOU with AIIMS Rishikesh under which Society will make available their high altitude hospitals as Study Centers for different courses in high altitude medicine to be conducted by AIIMS Rishikesh.

Come join us in this journey to witness your philanthropic dreams come true and to allow blossoming of your compassion and benevolence.

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

Founded in the year 2012 by a group of young Doctors and some philanthropists, Swami Vivekanand Health Mission Society is continuing its mission of providing high quality charitable health care to mankind. The Society started its journey by establishing their first charitable project in the form of a small dispensary at Dharmawala, a tribal dominated village, situated 40 km from Dehradun, Uttarakhand and bordering the states of Himachal Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh.

The self-belief of the Society to provide quality health care to the deprived, tribes, pilgrims and needy along with strong willed approach led to establishment of more hospitals in phases as well as the up gradation of the small dispensary of Dharmawala to a full-fledged multi-specialty hospital.

The Society with its vision and mission as the guiding principles also established charitable hospitals in three of the Char Dham's of the state of Uttarakhand. These are at Shri Badrinath Dham, Shri Kedarnath Dham and Gangotri Dham and are fully equipped with ICU facilities with staff trained in dealing with the health problems of high altitude. The vast number of pilgrims visiting these shrines

from all over the world used to suffer because of non-availability of quality health care and the morbidity and mortality at these shrines was worrying, the establishment of Society's hospital at these Dham's brought down the rates by 90%. Presently, 12 charitable hospitals are being run by the Society, out of which 11 are in Uttarakhand and one is in Delhi.

The Society apart from its charitable hospitals is also involved in other philanthropic activities like conducting community medical camps in remote, hilly and difficult to reach areas (during COVID wave also), education activities, making community self-reliant via Swavalamban Abhiyaan and community health programmes which encompass five programmes in itself (Anaemia Prevention, Control and Treatment Programme, Breast and Cervical Cancer Awareness and Screening Programme, Menstrual Hygiene Programme, Community Mental Health Programme and Oral, Head and Neck Cancer Awareness, Screening and Treatment Programme.

The "Nar Sewa Narayan Sewa" motto of the Society has been and will always remain the essence of all our endeavours to serve humanity.





Community Health Projects



Society in their endeavour to focus on the preventive aspect of health and wellness is running five community health programmes for health related conditions prevalent in the tribal and poor population. These include Anaemia Prevention, Control and Treatment Programme; Menstrual Hygiene Programme; Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening, Awareness and Prevention Programme and Oral, Head and Neck Cancer Awareness, Screening and Treatment Programme.



Anaemia Prevention, Control & Treatment Programme

SVHM Society with an aim to reduce prevalence of Anaemia in the tribal targeted population over a designated time period started this programme. Apart from Hb level estimation, deworming and IFA distribution focus is also on inculcating healthy dietary habits, hygiene with inclusion of locally available iron rich food in their diet. The programme has paid rich dividends and 74% of targeted Anaemic population is now non Anaemic.


My Pad (Menstrual Hygiene) Programme

To raise awareness and dispel the myths associated with the menstruation as well as to ensure menstrual hygiene, Society started a programme called My Pad in the tribal dominated villages in and around Dharmawala.

Breast and Cervical Cancer Awareness and Screening Programme

Breast cancer is the most common and Cervical cancer is the second most common cancer in women in India. Both of these are preventable and our programme emphasizes the same. Detection is by regular screening and tests like Mammography, Pap smear, blood tests etc. and regular follow up. Also we focus on awareness and teaching self – examination.

Community Mental Health Programme

The programme focusses on mental health issues of rural population and undertakes field visits where screening is done via a designated questionnaire. Suspected cases identified are then referred to the base hospital for confirmation, treatment and follow up.

"JEEVAK" Oral, Head and Neck Cancer Awareness, Screening and Treatment Programme

The project "Jeevak" has been started with a aim to thoroughly screen, early diagnose, investigate and treat OHNC. Also to inculcate the practice of routine self-examination and to promote tobacco cessation thereby reducing the prevalence of OHNC.

Success Stories

Dharmawala

- A 70 year retired Subedar from armed forces and a 40 year female patient, both hailing from remote tribal villages presented with a common complaint of severe backache radiating to both the lower limbs and difficulty in walking which they had been suffering since the last few years and were barely able to perform their daily activities.
- Both of them had taken multiple consultations and medications at various hospitals and clinics without any relief until they were referred by some patients to our spine OPD.
- Both were diagnosed as suffering from lumbar canal stenosis L3-S1 with instability which required complex spinal surgery.
- Anticipating a high cost of the treatment, they were surprised to learn about the miniscule charges and happily agreed to undergo the procedure.
- Both underwent spinal decompression & spinal fusion surgery successfully and had marked improvement in the signs and symptoms as well the difficulty in walking also lessened.
- Both the patients were highly grateful as well as happy and satisfied with their surgery done with such precision and low cost.





Shri Kedarnath Dham

- A 40 year male pilgrim from Bengaluru presented in the hospital with shivering, weakness and exhaustion.
- He was immediately attended to and found to be suffering from Hypothermia and acute mountain sickness.
- He was shifted to a warm environment as well as given other necessary medications and treatment including I/v fluids, Oxygen support etc.
- He stabilized within 4 to 5 hours and was discharged.

Gangotri Dham


- A 31 year old male pilgrim was brought by his friends in serious condition at 10.30 pm with complaints of cough, fever and difficulty in breathing.
- He had fallen sick while on Tapovan trek route and unable to get proper treatment anywhere else, was advised by local folk to visit our hospital
- He was diagnosed as suffering from acute mountain sickness and was immediately admitted to ICU.
- Subsequently in two days, he recovered completely and was extremely grateful to the Society and hospital staff.
- He also willingly donated for the hospital as well as assured full cooperation in future too.



Success Stories

Dharmawala

- A 15 year male patient presented with a complaint of watery discharge for the last 12 years from a small opening on the left side of neck which used to increase during eating.
- It was causing recurrent swelling and infection also.
- CT with Sinogram revealed 2nd Branchial fistula on left side.
- He was operated for Branchial fistula excision successfully by Dr Shreya Agarwal, ENT Surgeon and was cured of this congenital malformation.





Barkot


- A one and half year old male child presented to our OPD on 16th Nov with a complaint of injury over left leg due to a fall leading to fracture of his left thigh bone (femur).
- The child was given a hip Spica one leg cast after closed reduction under the guidance of an Orthopaedician.
- On follow up, the fracture had healed and fused completely.
- What makes this case special was availability of such a facility at a remote and hilly place.

Haridwar


- A 23 year old labourer hailing from a slum of Roorkee was crippled due to fracture of his right hip bone as a result of an unfortunate accident 2 yrs. ago. The treatment required a total hip replacement surgery, cost of which was beyond his reach due to the poor socioeconomic background.
- He continued to suffer from the ailment until he attended one of our outreach camps and was then referred by one of the camp volunteers to our hospital.
- The Society readily agreed to bear the expense of the surgery.
- He was operated successfully and was relieved of his malady and disability.






