From editor's desk:

The quarter witnessed a deluge of patients in our hospitals with seasonal illnesses and diseases displaying a big upsurge and overstretching the entire healthcare system. Such situations always bring out the best of the SVHM Society's team of dedicated and devoted professionals who worked relentlessly and tirelessly to cater and serve the community and provide them with utmost care and solace.

Achievements yet again took the centre stage in this quarter with the Spine department of Dharmawala hospital reaching the remarkable landmark of completing 100 surgeries since inception. Another watershed moment which also incidentally is the first for the State of Uttarakhand was equipping Shri Kedarnath Dham hospital with a unique Handheld Battery Operated X ray System. This Handheld X ray Device, weighing a mere 2.4 kg, functions as a DSLR camera and facilitates easy and quick X ray of the patients who cannot be moved / mobilized / are bedridden etc. Also the results can be viewed immediately on the spot.

The commencement of Ultrasonography facility in Uttarkashi hospital was another grandeur accomplishment which fulfilled a long standing unmet need of the local populace. True to their genre, Society responded promptly to attend to the flood affected victims of Delhi by holding free medical camps in their areas and sites. The Society provided medical check-up, medicaments and much needed relief to the needy and distraught folk residing in the makeshift camps. Another such intervention was serving the devotees of "Kanwar Yatra", an annual pilgrimage of devotees of Shiva during the Shravan month of Hindu calendar. The Society provided quality healthcare with mobile medical units as well as by organising camps on the routes of the Yatra.

Voluntary Doctors kept on providing their charitable services to the Char Dham hospitals in this quarter too and the Society left no stone unturned in ensuring the best of health care services to the pilgrims.

Society celebrations basket of the quarter included foundation day celebrations of Dharmawala, Petshal and Barkot, festivals of Guru Purnima, Guru Dakshina and Raksha Bandhan and Independence Day. All the celebrations were awashed with joy, ebullience and gaiety.

Dr V V Prasad, Sr Ayurved Consultant, Dharmawala Hospital was accorded with lifetime achievement award, conferred by Maganbhai Adenwala Medical University, Nadiad, Gujarat.

As we head towards another quarter, achievements will keep rolling and the motto of the Society will continue to bloom unabated.

Our Footprints

Founded in the year 2012 by a group of young Doctors and some philanthropists, Swami Vivekanand Health Mission Society is continuing its mission of providing high quality charitable health care to mankind. The Society started its journey by establishing their first charitable project in the form of a small dispensary at Dharmawala, a tribal dominated village, situated 40 km from Dehradun, Uttarakhand and bordering the states of Himachal Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh.

The self-belief of the Society to provide quality health care to the deprived, tribes, pilgrims and needy along with strong willed approach led to establishment of more hospitals in phases as well as the up gradation of the small dispensary of Dharmawala to a full-fledged multi-specialty hospital.

The Society with its vision and mission as the guiding principles also established charitable hospitals in three of the Char Dham's of the state of Uttarakhand. These are at Shri Badrinath Dham, Shri Kedarnath Dham and Gangotri Dham and are fully equipped with ICU facilities with staff trained in dealing with the health problems of high altitude. The vast number of pilgrims visiting these shrines

from all over the world used to suffer because of non-availability of quality health care and the morbidity and mortality at these shrines was worrying, the establishment of Society's hospital at these Dham's brought down the rates by 90%. Presently, 12 charitable hospitals are being run by the Society, out of which 11 are in Uttarakhand and one is in Delhi.

The Society apart from its charitable hospitals is also involved in other philanthropic activities like conducting community medical camps in remote, hilly and difficult to reach areas (during COVID wave also), education activities, making community self-reliant via Swavalamban Abhiyaan and community health programmes which encompass five programmes in itself (Anaemia Prevention, Control and Treatment Programme, Breast and Cervical Cancer Awareness and Screening Programme, Menstrual Hygiene Programme, Community Mental Health Programme and Oral, Head and Neck Cancer Awareness, Screening and Treatment Programme).

The "Nar Sewa Narayan Sewa" motto of the Society has been and will always remain the essence of all our endeavours to serve humanity.



Highlights of the Quarter



100+ Spine Surgeries - Removing Myths of Spine Surgery

Dharmawala

An amazing landmark which even beats the bigger centres dealing in spine ailments!
Surgeries : 100 + and counting
Patients Treated: 1500 + and counting
 Spine has always been the backbone of a healthy human body, an indispensable and multi functional pillar of stability. Spinal injuries and disorders can be a crippling and painful source of disability often affecting young breadwinners who get laid off work for days on end, causing distress to the entire family. An early and accurate diagnosis coupled with prompt and precise treatment can prevent much agony and preempt loss of many man hours.

Diagnostic and treatment modalities of spinal ailments are technology and implant driven, involve high costs thus becoming unaffordable to a large section of society.



Spine department began functioning from Feb 2022 onwards at Dharmawala hospital under Dr Tejasvi Agarwal and first spinal surgery was performed on 26th of Feb 2022. Any Spine surgery usually costs a minimum of Rs 1-1.5 lakhs and above, ironically which is unaffordable to the majority of our country. Remarkably the average cost of one spine surgery at Dharmawala hospital is approximately Rs 30,000 only which makes the facility affordable and accessible.



In the year 2022, the Society also partnered with “The Spine Foundation of Mumbai under the leadership of Dr Shekhar Y Bhojraj. The Spine Foundation is a pioneer in providing rural spine care throughout India, which makes our hospital also a Rural Spine Care Centre.



The Spine Foundation in coordination with HOPE Foundation Dehradun has been conducting free camps at SVCH Dharmawala and benefitted poor and underprivileged persons.

To make it more accessible to the unaffordable population the health workers of the Society hospitals were taught about all the “red flags” related to spinal ailments which made a huge difference in the outlook. Also these healthcare workers helped in spreading awareness about spinal care and removing myths related to spinal treatment which has been prevalent in the community since long.

Health for the people is the health of the nation and with this belief we hope that we will be able to provide quality spine care to all, especially the unaffordable.

A Giant Leap Forward by Society : Handheld Battery Operated X ray System

19th September - Shri Kedarnath Dham



In a major breakthrough and a first for the State of Uttarakhand, Society equipped its Shri Kedarnath Dham Hospital with a unique Handheld Battery Operated X ray System.

This innovative device is proving to be a boon for the Emergency Intensive Care Patients/ IPD Patients/ Trauma Cases/ Geriatric patients, immobilized patients etc. who cannot be moved/shifted/ are bedridden for radiological investigations.

The device which weighs a mere 2.4 kg, uses DR technology and functions as a DSLR camera thus facilitating quick and easy X ray of the patients

Importantly the results are available immediately which can be viewed on the spot for the benefit of the treating Doctor.

The simple operating mechanism of the device makes it a feasible and worthy option.

Notably in a short span of just 10 days of the equipment installation, a total of 292 X-rays have been done till 30th of September.

Shri Kedarnath Dham

A 27 year old female pilgrim from Assam en route to the shrine fell unconscious about 1 km before reaching the temple. As soon as the Shri Kedarnath Dham hospital team heard the incident, they rushed to the site with necessary equipment. The pilgrim was fully drenched and her oxygen level was 45 - 50%, sensing the need for immediate attention, hospital staff Mr. Dhanveer carried the patient on his back for about 100 - 150 meters to the hospital. The patient was speedily attended to and necessary treatment was done. Due to the blessing of Baba Kedarnath, the patient fully recovered and was discharged

Shri Badrinath Dham

A 49 years old local resident of Shri Badrinath Dham presented in our hospital with severe pain and inability to move his right shoulder. X ray revealed dislocation of right shoulder, which was reduced under local anaesthesia and then immobilized. The patient was then discharged.

A 57 years old male pilgrim injured his right shoulder as a result of a fall sustained while enroute to the Gangotri Dham. He was brought in great pain and discomfort to our Gangotri Dham hospital, where his X-ray revealed a fracture of the neck of right humerus. The patient was then stabilized, given a POP slab and discharged with advice to consult an Orthopaedician.
