SVHM Society did not wait and acting swiftly converted four of their hospitals for treating patient's suffering from COVID. Also it is remarkable that none of the SVHM hospitals at any point of time, turned away any patient found suffering from COVID/COVID like illness whether in OPD and/or in emergency. The general OPD as well as other departments OPD also kept on running throughout.

To alleviate the suffering of the rural and periurban area inhabitants, the Society hospitals regularly conducted numerous community medical camps by providing them much needed medical care. One rare feat was achieved when our Pipalkoti hospital team reached through treacherous terrain and dangerous trek to a remote, inaccessible and hilly village located 12 km away and where no medical team had ever set foot since independence.


Our OPD, emergency and community medical camps upheld their health services in full force at a time when majority of private practitioners and also government hospitals had curtailed their services including OPDs.


Proudly the SVHM Society is scaling new milestones with each passing quarter and year.





# SVHM SOCIETY IN COVID TIMES

DHARMAWALA, HARIDWAR, PIPALKOTI AND NARAYANKOTI

### PRIMARY LEVEL INTERVENTIONS

### COVID APPROPRIATE BEHAVIOUR ENSURED

- Use of mask.
- Washing of hands with soap.
- Use of sanitizers.
- Maintenance of social distancing
- Regular disinfection of premises
- Additional hand washing points installed in all hospitals.

### AWARENESS

- Pamphlets on COVID prevention distributed.
- Awareness material displayed at all prominent places in the hospitals.
- All staff (Doctors, Nursing, and Auxiliary staff etc) completed the online COVID 19 course of WHO.

### VACCINATION: ALL STAFF VACCINATED

- Dharmawala became a CVC (Covid Vaccination Centre).
- Local PHC was given space and logistic support for holding COVID vaccination at Dharmawala.

### SECONDARY LEVEL INTERVENTIONS

### **HOSPITAL LEVEL**

- Separate OPD (Flu OPD) was designated for influenza like illness patients.
- Staff were strictly monitored for fever and SPO2 levels before reporting for duty and after completion of duty hours.

### **COMMUNITY LEVEL**

- Medical camps held in villages for screening and treatment.
- Awareness sessions on Covid Appropriate Behaviour held in these camps.
- Also health education and awareness sessions and distribution of pamphlets on COVID done.

### **OTHERS**

- Surgeries resumed but patients were screened for COVID (RT-PCR) prior to the procedure and operated only after they tested negative.
- All lab investigations services continued their operations.
- All radiological investigations also continued.

### TERTIARY LEVEL INTERVENTIONS

### **HOSPITAL LEVEL**

- 4 hospitals converted into COVID hospitals
- All hospitals were treating patients suspected to be suffering from COVID like symptoms in their OPD as well as in the emergency.
- All needful and relevant investigation\* helping in diagnosing and progress monitoring for COVID done.

### MEDICAL REHABILITATION

- Post COVID rehabilitation OPD services started.
- Regular physiotherapy

• Health education continued in form of awareness sessions and distribution of pamphlets on COVID

### **OTHERS**

• Holistic Approach towards healing was being followed for COVID patients like daily chanting of "OM" and motivational talks.

A total number of record 910 HRCT scans were done at Dharmawala Hospital of suspected / confirmed COVID patients from April to June 2021.

# SUCCESS STORIES

### AYURVEDA DEPARTMENT DHARMAWALA

#### Pemphigus vulgaris case:

The department had a 19 yrs old male patient of Pemphigus vulgaris who had marked relief in his signs and symptoms after treatment. He had been suffering from this rare autoimmune disorder since last 5 years with no relief even after having taken numerous consultations at multiple clinics and hospitals. Pemphigus vulgaris causes painful blistering on the skin and mucous membranes.

The patient was treated with oral drugs, bath and sitz bath. In about two months time the old lesions began to heal, there was reduction in frequency and numbers of new lesions and recurrence of old healed lesions also stopped. After about 5 months the patient has largely recovered and there are no new lesions as well as no recurrence.

#### HARIDWAR

A suspected male COVID patient arrived at the hospital in respiratory distress with SPO2 level of 64% on room air and HRCT score as 21/25. Along with all the drugs and care, he was kept on a very high flow of Oxygen (24 lit/min).

Another suspected female COVID patient also arrived at the hospital in respiratory distress with SPO2 level of 54%, her HRCT score was also 21/25. Along with all the drugs and care, she was similarly kept on a very high flow of Oxygen (24 lit/min).

Both the patients who were critical at the time of admission, recovered fully with our care and were discharged in normal and healthy condition.

#### **DHARMAWALA**

A 70 yrs old male patient with SpO2: 65%, Pulse rate – 84/min, HRCT Score : 16/25 and

A 40 yrs old male patient with SpO2: 78%, and difficulty in breathing.

Both the patients who were critical at the time of admission, recovered fully with our care and were discharged in normal and healthy condition .

### LARGE UTERINE FIBROID REMOVED : DHARMAWALA

A 32-year-old unmarried female patient from Kalsi presented in our OPD with complaints of gradual swelling in abdomen since last one year and menstrual irregularities since last one and half a month. Also, she had additional complaints of severe weakness and fatigue. She was detected as severe anaemic with the haemoglobin level as 2.6 gm% and her USG finding revealed large sized uterine fibroid. Removal of the uterine growth by surgery seemed to be the best possible treatment for this patient. Hailing from a very poor socioeconomic background, she was unable to afford treatment at any other private facility. She was admitted and 6 units of blood, arranged by our hospital was transfused as to raise her haemoglobin sufficient enough to undergo any surgical procedure.

After undergoing the routine pre-operative investigation including haemoglobin and COVID 19 test and found to be fit, she was operated by the surgeon team of Dr. N. S. Chauhan and Dr. Vaibhav Pratap Singh with

anaesthesia by Dr. C. B. Verma. The entire procedure took more than two hours and the uterine fibroid weighing 5.5 kg was successfully removed from her abdomen. The patient was doing well post operatively and yet again a precious life was saved. The entire treatment including surgery was done at negligible cost.
