PETSHAL

Petshal hospital organized 5 community medical camps in Gunaditya, Khakri, Khola, Naini Jageshwar and Chami villages of block Dhaula Devi and Bhaisiya Chhana of Almora District. These villages are situated at a minimum distance of approximately 30 km to a maximum of 52 km from our hospital. These camps were held on 2nd, 9th, 10th, 28th and 30th of July.

These camps are providing huge relief to the villagers reeling under the seasonal health problems and illnesses. Our medical camps have been offering much needed medical facilities to these remote villages and sites.

The services offered in this camp consisted of general health check-up including measurement of BP, Temperature, Sugar, SPO2 along with nebulization and ECG facility as per the patient's requirement and illness. As always, all the facilities including medicines prescribed were given totally free of cost.

Common diseases/illnesses diagnosed and treated in the camp included:



- Diabetes
- Osteoarthritis
- Fever/Cold/Cough
- Fungal infections
- Scabies
- Infected wounds
- Abdominal pain
- Cataract
- COPD

SUCCESS STORIES (FEW OF THEM)

NARAYANKOTI

01-07-2021: A 42 yrs old male resident of Nepal engaged in a construction work at Kedarnath Dham suffered a cut injury while operating some machinery, over his thigh leading to profuse bleeding as the injury was deep and had cut his tendon as well. Patient was first taken to nearest government hospital of Sonprayag and then to Phata, both the hospitals expressed their inability to treat and referred the case to our SVHM Narayankoti hospital around 8 pm. As the cut was deep enough and needed special attention, the patient's wound was then thoroughly cleaned and taking full aseptic precautions tendon repair done along with suturing of flesh wound which needed 22 stitches.

The patient and his family members were very happy with the emergency treatment provided by the hospital and thanked the hospital administration wholeheartedly.



NARAYANKOTI



O3-07-2021: A male patient aged 24 years from Khumera village was brought to our hospital at 5 pm. He had met with a serious road traffic accident while driving a two-wheeler. The accident was so serious that the patient went into a state of unconsciousness. Along with the head injury, there were multiple wounds over his face. X-Ray was done which revealed blunt trauma of chest as well. All the necessary treatments were carried out and around 40 sutures were applied over the wounds of head and face.

The patient was then referred for CT scan of head to a higher center. On follow up it was found that the patient's condition has improved and was stable. The patient later thanked our hospital team for saving his life and providing such medical first aid facilities in hilly and remote terrains.

PIPALKOTI

12-07-2021: A male patient hailing from Niti Valley border area arrived with complaints of pain in lower jaw since 7 days. He was found to be suffering from pericoronitis and post detailed examination was advised surgical extraction. The surgical extraction took place successfully and he was relieved of his problem.

Coming from a border area and a very low socio economic background, the patient was unable to afford the cost of surgery in any of the other private hospitals. He was very thankful to our society for conducting his surgery free of cost



SUCCESS STORIES (FEW OF THEM)

DHARMAWALA

A 28 yrs old female arrived with a complaint of firm swelling inside her mouth on the right side since 4 yrs. Initially the swelling was small in size which later increased to the present level, leading to pain and discomfort during eating and chewing.

Hailing from a poor tribal background, she was unable to afford the cost of the procedure at any other private hospital and was in agony since last few months. The patient was successfully operated free of cost and cured of her suffering. She was full of praise for the SVHM team for providing her quality treatment at no cost.





A male child aged 9 months had tongue tie since birth and was having difficulty in sticking out his tongue. Also the problem was affecting his way of eating, speaking and swallowing.

He was referred at our dental department through one of our patients. The surgical procedure, frenotomy was conducted successfully and the child was relieved of his birth defect.






