This hospital known as Shri Maharishi Bhrigu Charitable Hospital is providing quality health care facilities to the poor, disadvantaged, impoverished as well as to the saint community. The hospital is poised for a major boost as it will start Ultrasound facility soon.

Society organised a cherishable "SVHM Parivar Milan" programme at Haridwar to foster a sense of connection and belonging among members who usually do not see each other frequently due to distances, busy schedules, or other reasons. The celebrations included Hindu Samrajya Diwas, International Nursing Day, International Yog Day and Narayankoti Hospital foundation day. All these were celebrated with full enthusiasm and joy. Visits 16 - 19 by distinguished guests was another highlight of the quarter, prominent among them were Shri Dhan Singh Rawat, Health Minister of Uttarakhand, Shri Tarun Vijay, Ex Rajya Sabha MP and many others. Everyone who toured our facilities was full of praise and appreciation.

Resumption of Homeopathic OPD at Dharmawala hospital along with addition of Physiotherapy and Eye departments at Uttarkashi Hospital were other notable events. The Society kept conducting multidisciplinary camps with usual momentum which included two mega camps at Dharmawala of which first was Social Service Camp conducted by UPASI under the banner of ASI, which witnessed eminent surgeons from all over the nation providing their services and next was third spine surgery camp held with support of The Spine Foundation Mumbai and HOPE (Helping Old People Everywhere) organization, Dehradun where complex spine surgeries were done by a highly accomplished team. Society's Uttarkashi and Haridwar hospitals also continued conducting multi-specialty camps for the benefit of the patients.

Society is always striving to enhance the capacity of their Doctors and staff, and in the same endeavour Dharmawala Hospital's Orthopaedician Dr Abhishek has been undergoing a month long training programme for Arthroscopic Surgery. The skill enhancement will help make available an advanced procedure which is usually accessible at selected few hospitals only. The quarter is witnessing lots of Doctors from all over India with their philanthropic gestures coming for voluntary services at our Chardham high altitude hospitals and helping the Society in realising their mission of providing high quality health care services to the pilgrims.

Society is continuing its mission of providing high quality charitable health care to mankind. The Society started its journey by establishing their first charitable project in the form of a small dispensary at Dharmawala, a tribal Society, out of which 11 are in Uttarakhand and one is in Delhi. dominated village, situated 40 km from Dehradun, Uttarakhand and bordering the states of Himachal Pradesh The Society apart from its charitable hospitals is also involved and Uttar Pradesh.

The self-belief of the Society to provide quality health care to the deprived, tribes, pilgrims and needy along with strong willed approach led to establishment of more hospitals in phases as well as the up gradation of the small dispensary of Dharmawala to a full-fledged multi-specialty hospital.

The Society with its vision and mission as the guiding principles also established charitable hospitals in three of the Char Dham's of the state of Uttarakhand. These are at Shri Badrinath Dham, Shri Kedarnath Dham and Gangotri Dham and are fully equipped with ICU facilities with staff The vast number of pilgrims visiting these shrines

Founded in the year 2012 by a group of young Doctors and from all over the world used to suffer because of non-some philanthropists, Swami Vivekanand Health Mission availability of quality health care and the morbidity and mortality at these shrines was worrying, the establishment of Society's hospital at these Dham's brought down the rates by 90%. Presently, 12 charitable hospitals are being run by the

> in other philanthropic activities like conducting community medical camps in remote, hilly and difficult to reach areas (during COVID wave also), education activities, making community self-reliant via Swavalamban Abhiyaan and community health programmes which encompass programmes in itself (Anaemia Prevention, Control Treatment Programme, Breast and Cervical Cancer Awareness and Screening Programme, Menstrual Hygiene Programme, Community Mental Health Programme and Oral, Head and Neck Cancer Awareness, Screening and Programme.

The "Nar Sewa Narayan Sewa" motto of the Society has been trained in dealing with the health problems of high altitude. and will always remain the essence of all our endeavours to serve humanity.

SVHM Society received a prestigious invite from AIIMS Delhi to explore the collaboration between two institutes and to share their experience, technical know-how and prowess in treating high altitude sickness and other health issues among pilgrims coming for the Char Dham Yatra. The Society which has been running ICU equipped fully free charitable hospitals in three of the Chardhams of the state of Uttarakhand was represented its team along with Professor & Head of Dept. Dr K P Kochar and other AIIMS faculty. The workshop was organised by the dept. of Physiology.



"Health ATM Machines Installed at SVHM Hospitals"

A total of 8 Health ATM Machines were installed at Dharmawala, Haridwar, Pipalkoti, Narayankoti, Barkot, Uttarkashi and Shri Kedarnath Dham hospitals provided through Director General, Medical Health and Family Welfare, Uttarakhand under the C.S.R. initiative of Hewlett Packard Enterprise.

A health ATM is a touch-screen kiosk hardware built for managing health-related information. By virtue of this health ATM, height measurement, weight measurement, temperature measurement, hemoglobin, blood sugar, blood pressure, oxygen & pulse measurement, lipid profile test, ECG, Eye test, Alcohol test, ENT & skin check up, IQ test, and many others could be done.

Society run hospital at Shri Kedarnath Dham and last year alone we served more than 1,13,000 pilgrims. Existing hospital being a 8 Bedded temporary facility with limited space is finding it difficult to cater such a large number of pilgrims averaging 1000 per day. To address this, a 50 bedded advanced high altitude hospital is now being built to provide state-of-the-art healthcare facilities to the pilgrims. Society has procured land and the construction has begun. Similarly the expansion of Shri Badrinath Dham hospital is also underway and will begin soon.
