From the Editor's Desk

The 2nd quarter and especially the month of September has been showered with ample blessings and milestones for Swami Vivekanand Health Mission Society and the auspicious bestowal from the Almighty was perceived in this quarter yet again with bountiful of exalted occasions decorating the platter.

The momentous happenings which heralded a new era were inauguration of Cath Lab facility on the 31st of August followed by inauguration of MRI and Digital Mammography on the 16th of September at Swami Vivekanand Charitable hospital, Dharmawala. Both of these have been provided via CSR initiatives, with Rotary Club of Delhi Ananta sponsoring the Cath lab and Airports Authority of India sponsoring the MRI and Digital Mammography.

In this illustrious quarter, no fewer than six of the fourteen hospitals mark their foundation day, while the SVHM Society too rejoices in the proud commemoration of its anniversary, together weaving a tapestry of heritage and celebration.

Aligning with the Society's objective of providing relief to the needy and afflicted persons in areas affected by calamities and disasters, Society immediately responded to the flood disasters of Dharaali, Uttarkashi and Tharaali, Chamoli by sending their teams from nearest Society hospitals. The teams trekked several kilometres to reach the site due to reduced road connectivity and set up temporary as well as mobile medical relief camps treating as well as offering solace to the disaster victims.

In conformity with the Society's mission statement of serving the pilgrims, hospitals of Haridwar and Delhi this year too organised medical camps for the Kanwar Yatra devotees who undertake an arduous annual pilgrimage during the Hindu month of Shravan.

Beginning of regular Super speciality OPDs of Oncology, Urology and Nephrology at Society's Dharmawala hospital was another highlight of the quarter and these new disciplines have enlarged the repertoire of super specialty OPDs substantially. Marking a major breakthrough in advanced orthopaedic care, the Orthopaedic Department at Dharmawala Hospital successfully performed its first-ever total hip replacement (THR) surgery.

Festivals and events as always in this quarter too were celebrated with much fanfare and amusement, thus invigorating and fostering feelings of togetherness, joy, and a strong sense of bonding among the SVHM Society family. The festivities included celebrations of Doctors Day, Guru Poornima and Guru Dakshina, Harela, Raksha Bandhan, Independence Day, Shri Krishan Janmashtami and Vishwakarma Jayanti.

The inauguration of Society's new advanced high-altitude hospital at Shri Kedarnath Dham, initially scheduled for September, had to be deferred owing to continual rains and adverse weather conditions, which hindered and prolonged the project's completion. A revised date for the event will be determined and communicated in due course.

SVHM Society's journey of selfless service will continue to shine brightly, and you are warmly welcomed to join in and embrace the profound satisfaction of serving humanity.

Founded in the year 2012 by a group of young Doctors and some philanthropists, Swami Vivekanand Health Mission Society is continuing its mission of providing high quality charitable health care to mankind. The Society started its journey by establishing their first charitable project in the form of a small clinic at Dharmawala, a tribal dominated village, situated 40 km from Dehradun, Uttarakhand and bordering the states of Himachal Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh.

The self-belief of the Society to provide quality health care to the deprived, tribal, pilgrims and needy along with strong willed approach led to establishment of more hospitals in phases as well as the up gradation of the small clinic of Dharmawala to a full-fledged multi-specialty hospital.

The Society with its vision and mission as the guiding principles also established charitable hospitals in the Char Dhams of the state of Uttarakhand. These fully free hospitals are at Shri Badrinath Dham, Shri Kedarnath Dham and Gangotri Dham and are fully equipped with ICU facilities with staff trained in dealing with the problems of high altitude. The vast number of pilgrims visiting these shrines from all over the world used to

suffer because of non-availability of quality health care and the morbidity and mortality at these shrines was worrying, the establishment of Society's hospital at these Dhams brought down the rates by 90%. Presently, 14 charitable hospitals are being run by the Society, of which 11 are in Uttarakhand, two are in Uttar Pradesh and one is in Delhi.

The Society apart from its charitable hospitals is also involved in other philanthropic activities like conducting community medical camps in remote, hilly and difficult to reach areas (during COVID wave also), education activities, making community self-reliant via Swavalamban Abhiyaan and community health programmes which encompasses five programmes in itself, Anaemia Prevention, Control and Treatment Programme, Breast and Cervical Cancer Awareness and Screening Programme, Menstrual Hygiene Programme, Community Mental Health Programme and Oral, Head and Neck Cancer Awareness, Prevention and Treatment Programme.

The "Nar Sewa Narayan Sewa" motto of the Society has been and will always remain the essence of all our endeavours to serve humanity.



Highlights of the Quarter

SVHM Society's Relief & Rescue work at Dharaali, Uttarakhand

A catastrophic flash flood triggered by intense rainfall caused debris-laden flows over Dharaali in Uttarkashi district, Uttarakhand, on the 5th August 2025. The sudden deluge swept away homes, bridges, roads, and claimed human lives. Responding without delay, the Society, through its nearest Gangotri Dham hospital, implemented a two-pronged relief strategy. One medical unit consisting of a doctor, nurse, and a pharmacist, equipped with essential medicines and logistics, was dispatched to the disaster zone, while another team remained at the hospital to treat the injured evacuated and brought in for care.

The mobile team endured a strenuous trek for several kilometres across flooded and damaged terrain to reach the affected area. The team provided medical aid both at relief camps and through mobile outreach, stopping and treating survivors wherever they were sheltered. Under the leadership of Dr Sushil Banuni, the team dedicated themselves from dawn to dusk treating, caring and consoling the victims. Additionally,

the Society replenished medical supplies in the ITBP run health camps, a gesture that was formally acknowledged and appreciated by their Medical Officer.





Orthopaedic Care at Dharmawala Hospital Heralds a New Era - Total Hip Replacement (THR) Surgery Begins

SVHM Society run Dharmawala hospital's Orthopaedic department conducted a first ever THR Surgery of one hip of a 55-year-old female patient. This patient was suffering from Bilateral hip dysplasia with secondary osteoarthritic changes and was in great pain and discomfort which had limited her mobility and daily routine activities markedly. The treatment needed THR which was available only at premier hospitals, costly and beyond the patient's financial capabilities. After having lost all hope of being able to walk again independently she presented in our Ortho department where under the proficient hands of Ortho Specialist Dr Abhishek Gupta was operated for THR of Right Hip on the 10th of September 2025.



SVHM Society's Collaboration with Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Skill Development Institute Empowering Rural Youth through Free Nursing Education

SVHM Society, in partnership with the Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Skill Development Institute, Kharghar (Navi Mumbai), introduced a distinguished programme aimed at empowering students from economically disadvantaged rural and tribal communities by facilitating their nursing education. The entire training, including food and accommodation, was provided free of cost.

After screening and a brief orientation at Society run Dharmawala hospital, 11 deserving students were selected for a 1-year GNM Assistant and a 2-year Diploma in Medical & Surgical Nursing courses and sent to Mumbai. After getting trained in essential nursing skills the students underwent clinical postings at ACTREC (Tata Memorial Centre) and Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation Hospital, gaining experience in various departments in a high-volume hospital setting. All these students successfully cleared the Maharashtra State Skill Development Board examination with distinction and proved their worth. SVHM Society will continue this noble mission to educate and empower many more such deserving youth for a brighter and self-reliant future.






